529 235 Units were sold under sales permit
Full compliance implemented as of 1 August 2019

Enforcement Results

2021/2022

Non-compliances found during market surveillance inspections

- Products displaying EU label (3 different brands)
- Products not having the EE label

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- EE label not placed on product but left in the manual or in the appliance.
- EE LOA expired and was not renewed (1 manufacturer)
- Online companies not displaying the EE label on online platforms

- Overall compliance rate in 2021/2022: 86%
- Compared to 16% in 2017 when enforcement of MEPS started

Successes of Enforcement Activities

- Product for destruction
 - 6 331 155 Incandescent lamps (R 63,4 million)
 - 372 Air –conditioners (R 3,7 million)
 - 48 Solar water heaters (R 235 195)
 - 1015 Audio and Video products (R 537 395)
 - 150 006 CFL's (R 2,1 million)
- Prevented 2nd hand fridges, laptops and audio video products from entering SA
- Currently enforcing compliance at a large online trader
